

Internship for Master Programs FAQs

What are the basic requirements to qualify for the Internship Program?

- Candidates must have strong extra curricular activity pre-Hult (i.e. club membership/ societies/ athletics, etc.)
- Candidates must demonstrate leadership qualities
- Candidates must have the ability to communicate fluently in written and spoken English in a professional environment
- Candidates must submit a statement of purpose describing his/her motivation for an internship

What are the academic requirements to qualify for the Internship Program?

- If the internship is facilitated by Hult, students must have a GPA of 3.0 by the end of Module A
- If a student facilitates his or her own internship, that student must be in good academic standing
- An Master of International Business or MA in International Relations student may apply to do an internship for credit, which is doing an internship in place of one of their elective courses. If the internship is for credit, it must be pre-approved by the Faculty Internship Coordinator.
- Students must have no honor code violations

A student may also do an internship that is not for credit. In this case the student continues to take the normal course load and does a non-credit internship on top of their regular class work. (In the U.K., this is dependent on Visa status)

What are some other requirements for the Internship Program?

- Student must be in full compliance with visa requirements
- Students must not have an open balance with Hult

When in the academic year does the Internship Program take place?

Master of International Business: Internships take place during Module C

MA in International Relations: Internships take place during Module C or D

How long does the Internship last?

At least 6 weeks

How many Credits is the Internship?

For credit bearing internships:

Master of International Business = 3 credits

MA in International Relations = 3 or 6 credits depending on length of placement

Can the Internship be combined with Rotation?

Master of International Business: No

MA in International Relations: Yes, students can rotate in Module C and take the Internship in Module D

Is the Internship Program Compulsory?

No. First, candidates must meet the defined criteria. However, the Internship Program will be the key platform to help students finding Internships either via Hult or on their own.

What is the process for students applying for an internship?

The student applies at the start of Module B. The application is reviewed according to the aforementioned criteria. An email is sent to the candidate confirming or denying the application in the first half of Module B. The Internship Preparatory Program takes place in the second half of Module B and the internship begins in Module C.

Are there any preparatory courses before the Internship? If so, when and how many credits?

Yes, there are workshops during Module B, but they are not offered for credit.
